

# **Nurse Supply and Education Southeast Region**

### **Community Demographic Information**

According to 2019 U.S. Census estimates, 2,188,158 people reside in the Southeast region, including Indian River, Martin, Okeechobee, Palm Beach, and St. Lucie counties – representing 10.2% of the Florida population.

**9.7% of Florida's nursing workforce are in the Southeast region**. There are an estimated 146 LPNs, 652 RNs, and 60 APNs providing *direct care* per 100,000 people.
