Council on Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA Council) @ 8:30am

Meeting was called to order at 8:34 am by Dr. Lois Gackenhimer, Chair of the C.N.A. Council.

The meeting began with introductions and the Pledge of Allegiance. The Chair welcomed the students from Concorde Career Institute. She reminded everyone that applicants who came forward would be sworn in by the Court Reporter, that individuals who came forward should pull the microphone close and state their name, that there should be no talking or emotional responses from the audience, that everyone should silence their electronic devices, where the restrooms were located, and about the break and allowing the council members a chance to use the restroom. The Chair also reminded any individuals who had not already signed in, to sign in.

Rachel Clark spoke about Driving While License Suspended or Revoked. She indicated that the first instance is a moving violation. Ms. Clark asked the Council to consider this as a minor offense. A second offense or more it is a criminal offense. She indicated that we do not really consider this as a criminal offense; that can be difficult to defend at DOAH as a crime against the practice of nursing. She also spoke about the changes to S. 456.0635, F.S. She spoke about the tiered effect and loop hole for those who were enrolled in school.

Ms. Clark also talked about previous denials where an applicant answered Yes to the Criminal history section on the application but No to the 456 section. She indicated that most applicants do not know what statute they were charged under. She advised the council that they may want to consider this in future applications.

Discussion ensued, The Council indicated that they were in favor of the recommendations Ms. Clark made.

Prometric plans to be present at the October meeting and will update the Council at that time.

Ms. King asked questions about the changes about 456.0635. She wanted to know about the 15 year time frame. The questions about the changes in the timeframe and about the exemption based on enrollment in an educational program were answered by the Council's Counsel and Board staff.
